

AGE/GRADE ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR BOYS 2009 HOLIDAY TIP-OFF AND 2010 SUMMER SLAM

AGE DETERMINING DATE FOR BOYS: September 1, 2010

Note: Boys' age categories are different than Girls' age categories. Girls playing on Boys teams must meet Boys age eligibility rules.

GRADE EXCEPTION: Players participating under the grade eligibility exception must be prepared to present proof of age and grade level. **Grade level is determined by player's grade on March 1, 2010** (i.e., for the Holiday Tip-Off it is the CURRENT grade; for the Summer Slam, it is the grade JUST COMPLETED.) The following apply to BOYS DIVISIONS:

15U/9th Grade [Summer Slam Only] - born on or after - September 1, 1994. **Exception:** A player in the 9th grade who was born on or after Sept 1, 1993 can participate in the 15U/9th grade division.

14U/8th Grade - born on or after - September 1, 1995. **Exception:** A player in the 8th grade who was born on or after Sept. 1, 1994 can participate in the 14U/8th grade division.

13U/7th Grade - born on or after - September 1, 1996. **Exception:** A player in the 7th grade who was born on or after Sept 1, 1995 can participate in the 13U/7th grade division.

12U/6th Grade - born on or after - September 1, 1997. **Exception:** A player in the 6th grade who was born on or after Sept 1, 1996 can participate in the 12 & U/6th grade division.

11U/5th Grade - born on or after - September 1, 1998. **Exception:** A player in the 5th grade who was born on or after Sept 1, 1997 can participate in the 11U/5th grade division.

10U/4th Grade - born on or after - September 1, 1999. **Exception:** A player in the 4th grade who was born on or after Sept 1, 1998 can participate in the 10U/4th grade division.

9U/3rd Grade - born on or after - September 1, 2000. **Exception:** A player in the 3rd grade who was born on or after Sept 1, 1999 can participate in the 9U/3rd grade division.
